The Triangular Trade Route involved the buying and selling of many different things, including enslaved African people.

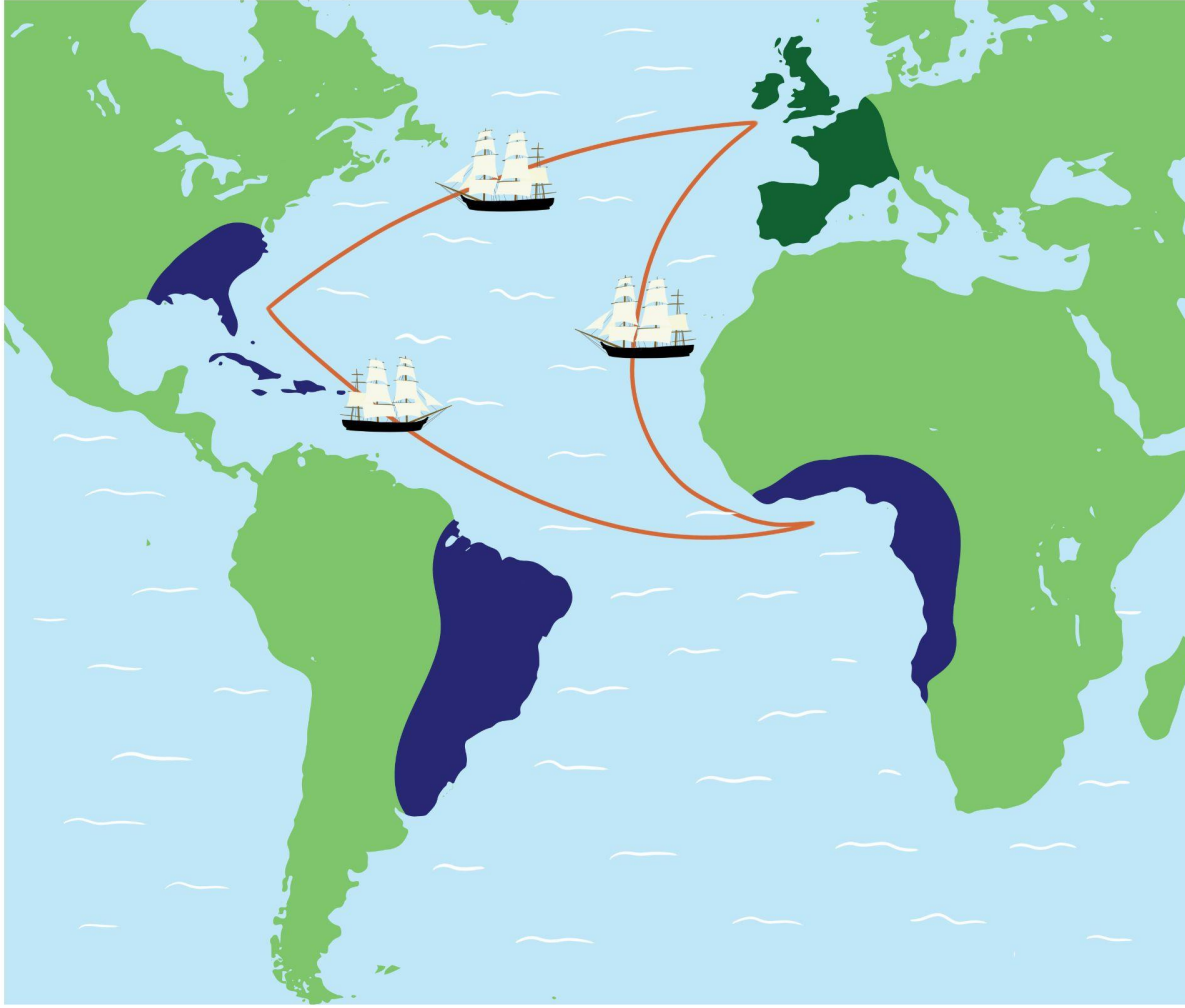
Test your knowledge of the Triangular Trade Route by labelling the map provided.
